You never know when an emergency might strike—the September 2018 natural gas explosions in the Merrimack Valley are case in point. Luckily, thanks to the support of generous donors, Lawrence General Hospital was ready. A decade ago, many gifts came together allowing us to open a Level III Trauma Center—one that is able to provide prompt assessment, resuscitation, surgery, intensive care, and stabilization of injured patients, as defined by the American Trauma Society.

Donors like the Rogers Family Foundation came forward to help Lawrence General transform an outdated emergency room into a beautiful Emergency Center, complete with revamped space, new technology, and equipment.
